Disability charity awarded over £300,000 in Lottery funding

Enrych provides training to improve digital skills for adults with disabilities

A DISABILITY charity which helps people around Leicestershire has been awarded over £300,000 **National Lottery fund**ing to kick-start a new project.

Enrych was awarded over £320,000 of National Lottery funding to begin their new service, Enrych Connect, to provide support and training to improve digital/IT skills in existing, new and emerging technologies for adults with disabilities throughout Laicetarships

out Leicestershire.

It will build on the work of Leicestershire County Council's Careonline, which was decommissioned at the end of December.

The funding has been awarded by the Big Lottery Fund, the largest funder of community activity in the UK.

said: "We recognise the good work done by Careonline over many years in aiding individuals with a disability to have access to IT skills through training and support on a one to one basis. The National Lottery has given Enrych a great opportunity to build upon this work.

"At Enrych we will be provid-ing support in the use of a range of equipment including iPhones, iPads, computers etc. to improve skills and also access services such as - FaceTime, Apps, Facebook, Skype and move with emerging changes in technolo-

Founded in 1986 by Leonard Cheshire and Sue Ryder, Enrych supports people with disabilities to be able to take part in both leisure and learning opportunities of their choice and, by doing so, reduce social isolation and




Wayne's story: Enrych – bringing an enhanced colour pallet to disability

I was recently invited to join Enrych's very own art group where there was an opportunity to engage in a spot of pottery. Initially, my response was, "How can I do pottery with only one non-dominant hand... post stroke?"

So after careful encouragement from Enrych's very own Sonia, my personal goal was set to create something fabulous from plain old air dry clay.

Being physically creative in finding ways to adapt, my mindset was that I could achieve my goal, and being in the friendly supportive environment of the group was extremely beneficial to me. To complete this challenge alone I quite possibly would have dismissed it as impossible.



I was also invited to try out other Enrych experiences such as the multisport group, attending the monthly Forum discussion group and several musical events in Leicester.

I loved the Philharmonia experience; I adored it! Enrych had the unique opportunity to offer this experience to their members and be part of both virtual and live performances.

I would not have had these experiences without my connection with Enrych. Enrych brings the community together and have a unique understanding of disability. They offer something very different to other charities I have been involved with. Connecting people together really helps to prevent the feelings of isolation that is so often associated with having a disability.

My Journey Through Enrych

My name is Ann and through Enrych I have learnt a lot about different situations and myself over the past year.

I became aware of Enrych through speaking to someone in the library.

I phoned the charity and was put in contact with Sonia Lear, as I was looking to do some volunteer work.

I became a befriender to a lovely lady, but unfortunately she become ill and it was short lived.

I myself became ill with depression/anxiety and Sonia supported me through this dark time.

She introduced me to many groups:

1.) Oasis Cafe in Hugglescote where I now volunteer

2.) Wellbeing Cafe, Shepshed

3.) Recovery College, Leicester, where I now have attended a couple of helpful courses
4.) Mental Health Matters where I was given a support worker

5.) LAMP in Leicester who help with advocacy.

Sonia knew I enjoyed art and crafts and invited me to the Enrych Art Group and I have become a volunteer and enjoy meeting people with different disabilities who do a variety of different art projects their way.

Enrych gave me support when I really needed it. I didn't feel alone. There is help out there; Enrych was a stepping stone on my road to recovery.

At Enrych we reach out to people with disabilities to support them to live richer and fuller lives to prevent isolation and reduce loneliness. Lynn and Jane are a new Enrych member and volunteer partnership. They were introduced to each other in June last year.

Here's their story. Enrych member Lynn says: "I really look forward to Jane's visits; she's really great company and we get on so well. Being housebound now



it's good to have visitors; it brings the outside world to me. To have the opportunity to chat, share memories and talk about my travels and life experiences, is important to me. It gives me something to look forward to and gives me a focus. I still miss my partner. He was originally a member of Enrych but when life took an unexpected turn Enrych found a lovely volunteer to visit me at home and also invited me to continue attending social events. It really means a lot to me and my family too. It has definitely made a positive a difference in my life."

Jane is a wonderful advocate for volunteering and gives her time not only to Enrych but to other charities too. Without volunteers like Jane, Enrych could not facilitate these essential community connections. Jane says:

"Volunteering is so rewarding. If you have some time to spare it's great to be able to give something back while you can. It's delightful to see what it brings to Lynn and her family too."

By bringing people from all walks of life together and enabling them to share time with each other, it provides something unique and rewarding to both volunteer and member. At Enrych we recognise these invaluable connections that are made, enabling people with disabilities the chance to shine.
